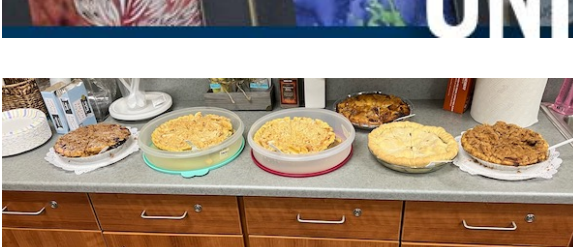


The Chris Center Presents "Neurodiversity: Increasing Awareness Around an Invisible Disability" Apr. 14
